Visit the seaside Oomi-jinja Shrine, dedicated to the sun goddess Amaterasu, where crimson torii gates and sacred straw ropes face the sea to ward off evil spirits. Venture to Hyuga Cape and Umagase, a breathtaking natural wonder featuring towering cliffs and hexagonal rock formations. The panoramic views from the Skelutcha Viewing Deck offer a thrilling perspective of the Pacific, making it a must-see for nature lovers and photographers alike.

Matsumae

Known as the “Little Kyoto of the North,” Matsumae is home to Japan’s northernmost castle, Matsumae Castle, a historic landmark surrounded by thousands of cherry trees. Each spring, the Matsumae Sakura Festival draws visitors with over 250 varieties of blossoms, traditional performances, and local cuisine. The town also preserves its rich Edo-period heritage at the Matsumae Historical Museum, offering travelers a chance to step back in time.

Hamada

Nestled on the Sea of Japan coast, Hamada offers travelers a rich blend of spiritual heritage and scenic charm. Journey inland to the revered Izumo Taisha Shrine, one of Japan’s oldest and most sacred Shinto shrines, famed for its towering architecture and its role in the mythology of matchmaking and creation. In Hamada itself, visit Sannomiya Shrine, a local spiritual site known for hosting lively Iwami Kagura performances—traditional Shinto music and dance that bring ancient legends to life. Then explore Tsuwano, a picturesque castle town often called the “Little Kyoto of San’in,” where koi-filled canals, samurai residences, and the hilltop Taikodani Inari Shrine create a timeless atmosphere.

Jeju Island, S. Korea

Known as the “Island of the Gods,” Jeju is South Korea’s premier resort island, celebrated for its volcanic landscapes, unique culture, and natural wonders.

Step into tranquility at Yakcheonsa Temple, a majestic Buddhist sanctuary nestled on Jeju’s southern coast. Its vast prayer hall and peaceful surroundings offer a serene escape steeped in spiritual beauty. Journey into the past at the Jeju Folk Village, where over 100 restored homes bring 19th-century island life to vivid reality.

Shodoshima

Experience the charm of Shodoshima with a visit to 24 Eyes Eigamura, a nostalgic movie village recreating scenes from the beloved 1954 film. Continue to Shodoshima Olive Park, Japan’s first olive grove, where hillside views, a Greek windmill, and playful photo ops await. And ascend into Kankakei Valley, one of Japan’s top gorges, with dramatic rock formations and breathtaking ropeway vistas—especially vibrant in autumn.

Important Booking Information

- All voyages on Mitsui Ocean Fuji are international cruises. Guests cannot board or disembark midway due to personal reasons.
- Guests must hold a passport with sufficient validity and arrange any necessary visas, entry permits and vaccinations required for the countries on their itinerary.
- On boarding the ship, guests are asked to register a credit card to cover onboard expenditure (accepted cards: VISA, MasterCard, American Express, Diners Club, JCB).
- The cruise itineraries in this brochure are not guaranteed. The itineraries, ports of call, departure and arrival times and routes are subject to change, including (without limitation) due to weather and sea conditions, mechanical difficulties or other unforeseen circumstances.
- Onboard facilities, rooms, and services are subject to change.
- Additional charges may apply to some onboard amenities, activities, and dining/bar experiences. This may include items such as specialty dining, select beverages, shore tours, shopping, upgraded Wi-Fi services, laundry services, spa services, fitness classes and medical services.
- Some ports can only be accessed using the ship's tenders or local ferry boats. Tender ports and tender boats are generally not accessible to guests who use a wheelchair. For safety reasons, guests who are unable to climb or descend stairs may not be permitted to board tender boats.
- Each cruise requires a minimum number of guest bookings. If this minimum is not met, the cruise may be cancelled.
- The pools and whirlpools onboard the Vessel do not have a lifeguard on duty. Children must be supervised by a parent or legal guardian at all times while in or near the pools and whirlpools.

- We welcome children 6 months and over on cruises of less than 30 days duration, and 12 months and over on cruises of 30 days duration or longer. For safety reasons, guest suites may not be occupied solely by individuals under the age of 15.
- Guests with underlying medical conditions, heart disease, or chronic respiratory disease should consult with their family physician before applying for the cruise. Guests undergoing dialysis are requested to please consult in advance with the travel agency through which your application is submitted. If guests wish to bring medical equipment (oxygen cylinders, etc.) onboard, please make sure to provide details when applying for the cruise.
- Due to limited neo-natal and specialist medical services onboard, guests who will be entering their 24th week of pregnancy or later at any time during the cruise cannot be accepted for boarding or booking.
- Guests may be requested to submit a "Health Questionnaire".
